The Bond St. Tea Rooms experience sets itself apart with a twist on the traditional British afternoon tea. To start, guests choose from a selection of Italian cicchetti, such as *Bruschetta of yellowfin tuna tartare*. This is followed by classic finger sandwiches with Mediterranean influences, including *Torn burrata with red chilli pesto on toasted focaccia*, homemade scones and deliciously indulgent desserts, such as *Blood peach panna cotta with golden crunchy milk chocolate*. The afternoon tea is of course complemented with a hot drink of choice and an optional addition of Champagne or prosecco.
